

## INAUGURATION OF COMMUNITY OF MAN

The Bicentennial Committee of the City of Miami announces the inauguration of a long-range project, the COMMUNITY OF MAN, to span the Bicentennial Era through 1989, the year commemorating the creation of the Continental Congress.

### WHERE IS THE PILOT PROJECT COMMUNITY OF MAN LOCATED?

The Coconut Grove "Community Development Target Area" occupies approximately one square mile between Highway U.S. 1 and Biscayne Bay.

### WHO ARE THE PEOPLES OF THE COMMUNITY OF MAN?

The U.S. Census reports an amazing representation of the peoples of the world: United Kingdom, Ireland, Sweden, Germany, Poland, Czechoslovakia, Austria, Hungary, Russia, Italy, Canada, Mexico, Cuba, India, Pakistan, Australia, China, Jamaica, Turkey, Colombia, Haiti, and the Bahamas.

### WHAT IS THE PLANNING BASE OF THE COMMUNITY OF MAN?

The Coconut Grove Planning Study and the Comprehensive Plan for the City of Miami are the base of a plan to be refined and augmented by major thinkers and planners. It is a collaboration between the City of Miami Planning Department and Daniel Urban Kiley as Review Consultant and Designer on a total plan for creating innovative kinds of environmental spaces as catalysts to community health and new life styles.

### WHAT ARE MAJOR PROJECTS?

(1) A Grand Design for the major axis of Grand Avenue and, within the overall plan, a system of green spaces fingering into the neighborhoods, and (2) a challenging plan for a School Park created by an overall design for the Tucker and Carver schools as well as the two adjacent park areas at the west end of Grand Avenue.

### WHAT IS THE CONCEPT OF THE COMMUNITY OF MAN?

It represents the condition of all peoples and it seeks to recognize the United Nations "Declaration of Principles" that "human beings are the most important element in the universe and environment is the common property of all mankind."

## THE CITY OF MIAMI IN NATIONAL FOCUS

Miami is the crossroads of four continents. It is the perfect location for a micro-model that seeks new societal solutions, that utilizes new energy sources, and that taps the minds of the foremost planners and thinkers of this nation. Four famous men -- Wilfred Owen, Daniel Urban Kiley, William R. Ewald, and René Dubos -- believe in the potential of the COMMUNITY OF MAN.
